  - Undertaking gender-generation sensitive action research-diagnostic, prescriptive and prognostic-in which the University's researchers and the researched work together so that the findings would be of use to the government in policy formulation, policy correction and remedial action
  - Adopting total quality management technique to attain augment and sustain excellence
    in all that the University does. The researchers make ambi-dexterous innovation with a
    view to making work relevant across periods and regions.

#### 8. Plans of institution for next year

The plan of the next year will be classified under research, teaching administration

**Research:** Every department will work on its specialized areas like language studies, new trends in historical discourse, Women studies, Development Studies, Dalith Studies, Tribal and Folklore Studies etc. While going for projects focus on societal orientation may be given. Other academic programmes like seminars, workshops are to be conducted. Extension and consultancy needs to be continued.

**Teachings:** Teaching and research go hand in hand. Teaching programs include, MA, Ph.D.(Integrated Program), M.Phil., Ph.D., D.Litt and PG Diploma Programs.
