- Undertaking gender-generation sensitive action research-diagnostic, prescriptive and prognostic-in which the University's researchers and the researched work together so that the findings would be of use to the government in policy formulation, policy correction and remedial action
- Adopting total quality management technique to attain augment and sustain excellence in all that the University does. The researchers make ambi-dexterous innovation with a view to making work relevant across periods and regions.

8. Plans of institution for next year

The plan of the next year will be classified under research, teaching administration.

- 1) **Research:** Keeping in view the current in relevance of the issues, every department shall have projects relating to the specialised areas focusing on societal orientation. Such academic programmes may include seminars, workshops, and extension activities also.
